

Prayer Meeting for the New Building Project on Monday 26th February

The new building plans are progressing well, but we are very aware that prayer is the most important part of the whole process; particularly individual prayer, but also praying together. If you are able, please come and join us for prayer at **165 Marlow Bottom from 8 – 9.30pm** and to hear where we're up to.

The trees in front of St. Mary's - As we continue with the work towards a new building an issue has arisen about the two big trees in front of St Mary's. Neil Barr, the Architect working with us on our new building, and David Mason, the Oxford Diocese advisor on Church buildings, have both strongly recommended that we remove these trees in the next month or so.

They advise that we remove them now because it is not uncommon that people who want to prevent building developments happening have taken out "Tree Preservation Orders" on a particular tree or trees. There is a small risk that this may happen with our trees. If this were to happen it would almost certainly increase our costs as we would have to take on legal experts to find a way forward and it would also likely delay the building project considerably. The trees will be taken down anyway by any developer who buys the site from us. This recommendation has come from Neil and David, is supported by the team running the building project and has been agreed by the St. Mary's Church Council.

A secondary reason for the removal of these trees is that when our drains got blocked last year the company who came in to sort out the problem put a camera down the pipes to the septic tank under the ground at the front of St Mary's. They found that roots from the trees had started to break into the pipe leading to the tank. It wasn't something that would have an immediate effect but was something we were warned would need to be looked at in the future.

If the trees are going to be removed it really needs to happen in the February half term coming up. This is because it is a two day job and so ideally needs to be done when the Pre-School isn't in. To wait until the Easter holidays brings the risk that birds might have started nesting.

So all in all and with some sadness the two big trees in front of St Mary's will be removed this week."

Children and Communion
