## **Rota for closing the church**

We are looking for new members of the team that serves all four of the churches in our team. Might you be able to serve as:

**Team Treasurer** - working alongside Dave Bull and 4 Church Treasurers to manage our small (£30k) team-wide budget (mainly clergy expenses and parish office costs) co-ordinate the annual accounts process. Requires numeracy (not necessarily accountancy) skills, good communication and team work.

**Weddings welcomer** - a Sunday role, looking out for and welcoming engaged couples and helping them to choose the venue for their wedding. Making them feel at home as they come (as many do) to worship with us in the lead up to their wedding. Also organising and administrating our popular Marriage Preparation Course over 4 evenings each spring.

**Baptism co-ordinator** - working with Sarah Fitzgerald to organise and administrate the 50 or so children's baptisms we host across our 4 churches each year. The role involves receiving initial applications, working with families to identify the best service option and dates, which can sometimes be a challenge when we are booked up six months in advance. It also involves running the 'Baptism Diary' for All Saints' Marlow. Requires a welcoming spirit, good administration and sometimes good diplomacy skills!
