The Organ in All Saints' Church

The present instrument dates from 1876, when Henry "Father" Willis built a new three manual organ of 32 stops, possibly incorporating parts of a slightly earlier instrument. It was rebuilt in 1955 by the John Compton Organ Company, and again by Mander Organs in 1996/97. Almost all of the Willis pipework survives, and thus we can hear the organ much as it first sounded over 130 years ago.
